Light wood tones like ash or pale oak create an airy, spacious feel perfect for compact homes or minimalist interiors.

Dark tones like walnut or teak add richness and sophistication, ideal for larger spaces.

Mid-tones strike the perfect balance, offering warmth without overpowering the room.

Before choosing, ask yourself: do you want the space to feel cosy, expansive, dramatic, or calm?

### CREATE CONTRAST WITH WALLS

Matching your flooring and walls too closely can make a space feel flat. Instead, aim for contrast.

Dark wooden floors pair well with light or neutral walls

Light flooring looks elegant against deeper shades like charcoal or navy

In smaller rooms, lighter combinations can make the space feel bigger, while bold contrasts work well in larger areas to add depth and dimension.

### BALANCE WITH FURNITURE AND FINISHES

Your furniture should complement not compete with your flooring.

If furniture and flooring are similar in tone, add contrast through rugs, cushions, or wall dcor

Pair light floors with darker furniture (or vice versa) for a balanced look

Mixing finishes also helps. Matte wooden floors combined with glossy cabinets or metallic accents can create a layered, designer feel.

### USE PATTERNS TO SHAPE THE SPACE

Flooring patterns can visually transform a room.

Straight planks make spaces look longer

Diagonal layouts add movement

Herringbone or chevron patterns bring elegance and visual interest

In open-plan homes, consistent flooring ensures flow, while subtle pattern changes can define different zones.

### CONSIDER FUNCTION AND LIFESTYLE

Good design is practical. Choose flooring based on how the space is used.

High-traffic areas need durable finishes

Bedrooms should prioritise comfort and warmth

As Parul Mittal notes, engineered wood flooring is increasingly preferred in modern homes as it offers the look of natural wood along with better stability and resistance to moisture, making it suitable for diverse climatic conditions.
